This consultative study document will form part of today's discussions. Furthermore, the outcome of today's discussions will inform the recommendations on defining the regulatory framework that will enable the commencement of chapter 7 of the Communications Act (No 8 of 2009).

It is worth mentioning that based on the outcome of the first phase of collection, there are further questions that we require your assistance with, by means of completing a questionnaire that will be distributed at the end of this hearing and will be due for submission on 16 November 2015.
